- Pre-course reading material will usually be available at the SCOPE Office for collection from the date listed in the 'collection pre-course reading' column.
- Teaching dates – each module is taught in a nine day block Saturday to following Sunday with a reading time before teaching starts and an assessment period after teaching ends.
- Class times – Saturdays 1330-1900, Sundays 0930 –1830, weekdays (Monday – Wednesday & Friday) 1830-2130; teaching times may be subject to slight change by direct agreement between tutor and students in Hong Kong. Note: there are no classes on Thursday – this is to allow preparation/research time on Thursday evenings.
- Students will be notified of classrooms by City University staff before the taught section of the module begins.
- Whilst it is intended that this schedule be final it may be necessary, in exceptional circumstances (such as illness of a tutor) for changes to be made. Students will be notified of any changes as early as possible.
- Students must attempt/complete all modules.
- The tutor teaching in Hong Kong may vary from that shown but will always consist of an academic member of staff from Wolverhampton Business School who is part of the module team in the UK.
- Mid-Autumn Festival is Saturday 3rd October 2009 and 22nd September 2010 so scheduling of modules is not affected.
- Cheung Yeung takes place on 26th October 2009 and 16th October 2010 so scheduling of modules is not affected.
